## **Trueblood Preschool – 8<sup>th</sup> Grades**

### **RFS Trueblood Preschool Supply List – Roxanne Steele Lead Teacher**

1. Package WASHABLE markers
2. 1 dry erase marker
3. 1 Ream of copy paper (white or colored)
4. 4-6 Glue Sticks
5. 8 inexpensive washcloths or kitchen dish clothes. We will use these for reusable napkins in the classroom. Do not label they will be mixed. Light colors preferred so we can occasionally bleach them.
6. 2 boxes Kleenex
7. 1 large bottle of bubbles= girls/ or  
1 can foam shaving cream= boys
8. 1- 3 ring binder ½ inch to 1 inch labeled with your child's name on it.
9. 25 or more sheet protectors for use in the 3 ring binder.
10. Refillable water bottle with the child's name on it.

Boys- 1 box ziplock style freezer bags quart size

Girls- 1 box ziplock style bags gallon size

**Optional:** 1 bottle liquid dishwasher soap, 1 bottle Dawn liquid dish soap, 1 bottle vegetable oil, 1 bottle vinegar

\*Families will sign up for morning snacks on a weekly basis\*

#### **All Students should have available in your child's cubby:**

Rain boots or second pair of shoes and socks

Sweatshirt or jacket

Please send in 2 complete changes of clothes with shirt/underwear, shorts or pants. We will put those in a labeled zip lock bag and store in the bathroom. When an change is made the wet or dirty clothes go home for washing and you need to send in a replacement set please.

#### **Full day students need to bring:**

Lunch daily with an afternoon snack packed in lunchbox. We encourage the use of reusable containers and sending utensils from home. Let's be kind to our Earth and reduce trash!

Blanket and pillow for rest time. Small stuffed animal and crib sheet to cover the cot are ok also.

**School supplies to be shared in the classroom**

- 1 set of regular pencils (sharpened)
- 1 ream (500 sheets) of white copy paper 8 1/2" by 11"
- 1 box of Kleenex
- Markers – 2 sets of regular Crayola markers and 1 set of thin line Crayola markers
- Glue - 1 bottle of Elmer's brand school glue and 1 pack of Elmer's brand glue sticks
- 2 rolls of scotch tape

(Elmer's and Crayola are preferable as they seem to have longer shelf lives over other brands)

**Personal supplies –please label all items with your child's name**

- 1 pocket folder (any color or images)
- 1 red pocket folder
- 3 spiral notebooks with lined paper - 8 1/2" by 11"
- A water bottle that will stay at school
- A complete change of clothing placed in a labeled plastic bag

## RFS 1-2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Classroom Supply List – Laura Sheets, Teacher

### DO LABEL with child's name

- Change of clothes, zip-closed and placed in a extra-large Ziploc baggie with your child's name on it:
  - 1 pair of pants (not shorts); 1 long-sleeved shirt; 1 pair of underwear; 1 pair of socks
- Plastic pencil box. (approximately 8.5" x 6"). Bring to school empty.
- 2 folders with pockets. (Not plastic) Write name on the **outside FRONT cover.**
- 1 sturdy plastic cup (no attached straws or lids)
- 1 sturdy plastic plate (**without** dividers)
- 1 backpack, to be brought to school every day
- 1 empty, adult-sized shoe box (name on **underside** of box)

### DO NOT LABEL with child's name

(These items will be used communally, so having names messes things up).

- 1 ream of white printer paper
- 1 pack of Crayola Super Tips Washable Markers (pack of 50)
- 1 box of tissues
- 1 pump bottle of hand soap
- 1 roll of plain, all-purpose masking tape
- 2 composition books (not spiral) - traditional marbled style in **black and white**
- 1 pack of construction paper (multi-color or all one color, your choice)
- 1 pack of 3" x 5" index cards (lines on one side)
- Watercolor paper (1 pack of white 9" x 12" tear-off sheets)

- 1 box of colored sidewalk chalk

### **RFS 3-4<sup>th</sup> Grade Classroom Supply List – Jennifer Quijano, Teacher**

- 40-50 SHARPENED #2 pencils
- Individual pencil sharpener (small enough to fit in the palm of your hand) • Large pink or white eraser
- Crayons
- Colored pencils
- 1-2 ink pens (any color except red or black)
- 3 glue sticks
- Scissors
- Ruler (inches & centimeters)
- 5 pocket folders – one each of: red, yellow, green, blue, purple
- 4 Spiral notebooks
- 2 Composition Notebooks- for Music and Spanish
- Clipboard
- 1-2 clean, old socks (to use as erasers for dry erase boards)
- Ear buds in a plastic bag labeled with your student's name

The following items will be collected and shared with the class:

- 1 package of Expo Dry erase markers
- 1 ream of computer paper
- 1 ream of construction paper
- 1 ream of wide ruled lined notebook paper
- 1 box of tissue-with no lotion
- 1 Container of Clorox Wipes
- 1 package 3 ½" x 5" note cards (White or multicolored)
- 1 package of multicolored sharpies
- Washable Markers
- A few sheets of poster board
- 2-3 rolls scotch tape
- Medium size post-it notes

### **RFS 5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> Grade Classroom Supply List – John Sheets, Teacher**

1. 2 composition books (the stitch bound type) with graph paper inside for math work. Ordering online is sometimes faster than trying to find these locally, but I think Office Max usually has them in stock.
2. A ream of copy paper- that means 500 sheets- high recycled content is smiled at.
3. An extra set of clothes for emergencies, like if your child should get extremely wet or dirty if we play outside in the rain (no lightning, of course), contained in a bag with their name on it. This isn't important until it is important, and then it is a necessity.
4. Either a pack of magic markers and/or colored pencils for personal use (whichever the student prefers) in a container marked with the student's name. If they are old, make sure they still work.
5. 2 boxes of tissues for communal use.
6. 100 3" X 5" lined note cards.
7. 2 glue sticks.
8. 200 sheets of lined paper (wide ruled is best)- the higher the recycled content the better.
9. A backpack to safely transport work and books to and from home.
10. 2 lined composition books- the stitched-up type- but feel free to buy the cheapest with a good, hard cover. They are for my class and Spanish. If your student has a Spanish composition book from last year, and it is in good condition, they should bring it back for next year's use.
11. A roll of masking tape.
12. One trifold 36X48 cardboard poster. The student's name should be written on the back. The 36X48 refers to inches not feet or miles.
13. Students have headphones provided for computer use in class, but students may bring in a pair for personal use that will NEVER be shared with peers. If a pair is brought to class, it should remain in class and not be brought back and forth from home to school each day.
14. A durable 2-pocket folder for Choir
