## Camps for ages: 2 yrs., 9 months-3rd grade

July 8-12 (9am-12pm)\*  
**All for Creative Arts! - An Artsy Exploration Camp**

July 15-19 (9am-12pm)\*

## Camps for ages: 5th-9th Grades

July 8-12 (9am-12pm)  
**Ceramics Camp with Kate!**

Join RFS middle school teacher, Kate Hogg, to learn the basics of hand-building in this "intro to ceramics" experience: a coil pot, a decorative ceramic tile, and wind chimes. Various texturing techniques will be explored, and students will have the opportunity to glaze and fire their pieces thanks to Earlham College. Tools and materials are provided. Old clothing and shoes are suggested!

July 15-19 (9am-3pm)  
**Fish for Life: A Fishing Adventure Camp**

What's a summer without FISHING?! Students will join 5th-6th grade RFS teacher, John Sheets, and travel to a different local fishing spot (or two!) every day. Learn how to use artificial and live bait. Identify different fish and learn how to humanely catch and release any fish that are caught. Photos will be taken and shared to highlight our successes! Students do not need to bring a fishing pole but are encouraged to bring one if they have one at home.

July 22-26 (9am-12pm)  
**Building Tomorrow! – A Robotics Camp with LEGOs**

LEGOs and ROBOTS in one camp? Yes, please! Under the guidance of John Sheets, students will be partnered up to learn how to build and program LEGO robots. Advanced students will be allowed to focus on exploring what the robots can do and testing various hypotheses. Students who sign up with a friend can be partnered together. Completed robots will be videotaped and shared digitally to communicate our progress!

Camp ages are determined by the grade the student is entering in the fall. Children participating in Fish for Life OR a morning camp and Summer Fun should bring a packed lunch each day. Full day camps are \$150; half day camps are \$100. Students who attend a morning camp and "Summer Fun" will be charged the fee for a full day (\$150). All camps take place at Richmond Friends School- 607 West Main Street in Richmond, IN.
