Dear PreK-K Families,

I hope that you have been finding ways to have many fun and safe adventures this summer. It is hard to believe how quickly the summer days seem to be going by. To get us prepared, I have compiled a list of supplies that will be important to have ready by the start of school. Each student will have, and be responsible for, most of their own supplies in the classroom.

School supplies for individual use:

- 1 set of regular pencils (sharpened)
- Markers – 3 sets of regular Crayola markers and 3 sets of thin line Crayola markers
- 2 rolls of scotch tape
- 1 roll of masking tape
- 1 package of assorted construction paper
- 1 package of colored pencils
- 1 package bullet-tip whiteboard markers

(Crayola are preferable as they seem to have longer shelf lives over other brands☺)

Personal supplies –please label all items with your child's name

1 pocket folder (any color or images)

3 spiral notebooks with lined paper - 8 1/2" by 11"

A water bottle that will stay at school

A complete change of clothing placed in a labeled plastic bag **WHICH INCLUDES 2 SPARE FACE MASKS**

A Backpack (large enough to fit an upright 8 1/2" x 11" piece of paper, or larger)

A Lunch Box

A photograph of you and your family for display.

Supply List for Laura's class: 2021-2022

LABEL with your child's first name

- 1 standard-sized, plastic pencil box (approx 8.5" x 6")
- 1 leak-proof, reusable water bottle.
- 1 lunchbox with child's name written on the outside front.
- 1 backpack with child's name written on the outside front.
- 3 paper (not plastic) folders with pockets with child's name on the outside front.
- 1 sketchbook (8.5" x 11" or 9" x 12")
- Write down the names of 2 fun/free game websites that you like.
- Extra clothes in the event of some sort of mess, in a large labeled Ziploc baggie
 - 1 pair of pants (not shorts)
 - 1 long-sleeved shirt
 - 2 pairs of underwear
 - 2 pairs of socks
- First grade students only: 1 composition book (not spiral) - traditional marbled style in black and white. These are for Spanish class.
(Second graders will continue using their same Spanish composition books, which Rae has at school.)

DO NOT LABEL

- 1 ream of white printer paper
 - 4 (or more) thick, chisel-tip, dry erase markers (any colors except yellow)
 - 1 box of 20-count Crayola Super Tips Washable Markers
 - 1 large box of tissues (the type that pull out the top)
 - 1 pad of watercolor paper (9"x12")
 - 2 washcloths
 - Ticonderoga pre-sharpened pencils , 10-pack (or more)
 - Fun stickers (at least one sheet)
 - 1 foaming pump soap
- **Bring supplies on the first full day of school (not to the family workday).**

RFS 3-4th Grade Classroom Supply List

- 1 ream copy paper
- 1 box tissues
- 1 package of at least 4 dry erase markers
- 2 old socks or cloths to be used as dry erase markers (cheap cotton work gloves also work well)
- 1 box of pencils
- 2 big pink erasers
- 1 box of markers (thick or thin, your choice)
- 2 glue sticks
- 1 package wide ruled loose leaf notebook paper
- 5 pocket folders
- 2 sheets of poster board
- 1 composition notebook for Spanish, last year's is fine
- 1 ruler with inches and centimeters

Optional items

- pencil box Each student will have a plastic bin supplied by the school, but a pencil box to go inside that can be helpful.
- ear buds The classroom has headphones , but if you prefer your own personal ear buds you can bring those.

Feel free to keep using notebooks, folders, etc. from last year. They don't need to be new as long as they have plenty of blank pages. There are colored pencils, crayons, and scissors in the classroom for students to use.

Classroom Supply List for the 5th-6th Grade Class

2021 to 2022 School Year

1. 2 composition books (the stitch bound type) with graph paper inside for math work. Ordering online is sometimes faster than trying to find these locally, but it is not impossible
2. A ream of copy paper- that means 500 sheets- high recycled content is encouraged.
3. An extra set of clothes for emergencies, like if your child should get extremely wet or dirty if we play outside in the rain, contained in a bag with their name on it. This isn't important until it is important, and then it is a necessity.
4. Either a pack of magic markers and/or colored pencils for personal use (whichever the student prefers) in a container marked with the student's name. If they are from this past year, make sure they still work.
5. 2 boxes of unused tissues for communal use. The unused part is a joke.
6. 100 3" X 5" note cards, the kind with lines on one side and no lines on the reverse.
7. 2 glue sticks.
8. A backpack to safely transport work and books to and from home.
9. 2 lined composition books- the stitched-up type with lined paper- but feel free to buy the cheapest with a good, hard cover. They are for my class and Spanish. Spanish composition books from last year can be used for the coming year. Those lucky students will only need 1 new composition book.
10. A roll of masking tape. The wider the roll, the better. Seriously, students get excited about wide masking tape.
11. One trifold 36" X 48" cardboard poster. The student's name should be written on the back.
12. Students have headphones provided for computer use in class, but students may bring in a pair for personal use that will NEVER be shared with peers. If a pair is brought to class, it should remain in class and not be brought back and forth from home to school each day.
13. One bottle of hand soap to use for the cleaning of hands. Water will be provided by the sink.
14. One pocket folder for Spanish for keeping track of handouts and homework. Plastic lasts the whole year. Paper folders sometimes have to be replaced.
15. A bunch of pencils, say, 24. I might ask for some more halfway through the year. If you bring 48 at the beginning of the year, I promise I will not ask for more later in the school year.
16. One bottle of rubber cement.

Middle School Supply List for 2021-2022

Personal Supplies

We encourage you to re-use supplies from last year when possible.

- Pencils (at least 25)
- Pencil top erasers
- Blue or black ball point pens (at least 6)
- Colored markers
- 2 glue sticks
- 6 pocket folders (plain please-no designs or images, but any solid color is fine). Please label: English, Social Studies, Science, Math, Spanish, Music & Art (they share 1 folder).
- 6 composition notebooks: one each for Reading, Writing, Social Studies, Science, Music, and Spanish (either wide or college ruled). 8th graders may use their Science, Social Studies, Music, and Reading notebooks from last year but will still need to purchase a new Writing notebook. Rae would like students to use their same Spanish composition book from last year.
- 1 composition notebook with graph paper for Math
- 1 sketch pad, around 9"X12" for Art. Pick one you like; it doesn't need to be fancy. Canson, Blick, and Strathmore are fine brands. Here's one Jennie likes by [Canson](#).
- Scientific calculator similar to TI-30XIIS. You will not be able to share calculators this year. Please make sure you have one with you at school clearly labeled with your name.
- Ruler
- Container (like a pencil box) to hold pencils, pens, etc.
- Yoga mat (approximately 68" x 24" x 4mm) There are many to choose from and can be purchased in town (e.g., Meijer, Walmart, Dick's Sporting Goods) or online. Here is [one option](#) and [another \(non PVC\)](#).
- Decor for inside of locker (optional)
- Hand sanitizer

Supplies for classroom

- 1 ream of computer paper
- 1 set dry erase markers
- 1 roll scotch tape (we have a dispenser)
- 2 boxes of tissues
- 2 poster boards (22" x 28" or similar)
- 2 pads of 3X3 Post-It notes for the classroom supply
- 4 bottles liquid hand soap
