- A photograph of you and your family for display.

## Family Supply List for Laura's class - Fall 2022

## Write Your Child's Name On All These Things

- 1 standard-sized, plastic pencil box (approx 8.5" x 6")
- 1 leak-proof, reusable water bottle.
- 1 lunchbox with your child's name written on the <u>outside front</u>.
- 1 backpack
- 3 paper (not slippery plastic) folders
  - with inside pockets
  - · write your child's name written on the top front of each folder
- 1 sketchbook (8.5" x 11" or 9" x 12")
- First-grade students and new-to-RFS students:

1 composition book (not spiral) - traditional marbled style in <u>black and white</u>. These are for Spanish class. Name on outside front.

(Returning second graders will continue using the Spanish composition books they already have, which Rae has at school.)

## **Do NOT Put A Name On These Things**

(They will be used communally.)

- 1 ream of white printer paper
- 4 (or more) thick, chisel-tip, dry erase markers (any colors except yellow)
- 1 box of 100-count Crayola Super Tips Washable Markers https://www.amazon.com/Crayola-Super-Washable-Markers-Count/dp/B071CP6X88?th=1
- Fun stickers (at least one sheet)
- 1 foaming pump soap
- 3 Elmer's Disappearing Purple glue sticks
- 1 small box quart-sized Ziploc baggies
- 1 box of 24-count Crayola Pre-Sharpened Colored Pencils https://www.amazon.com/Crayola-Colored-Pencils-Assorted-Colors/dp/B00004YSXF?th=1
- Bring supplies on the first full day of school (not to the family workday).

### **3rd-4th Grade Classroom Supply List**

- -1 ream copy paper
- -1 box tissues
- -1 package of at least 4 dry erase markers to donate to the classroom. If students want their own, please bring a second package for them to keep in their cubby.
- -2 old socks or cloths to be used as dry erase markers (cheap cotton work gloves also work well)
- -1 box of pencils
- 1 package of erasers to go on the end of your pencils.
- -1 box of markers (thick or thin, your choice)
- -2 glue sticks
- -5 pocket folders
- -2 sheets of poster board
- 1 composition notebook for Spanish, last year's is fine
- 1 ruler with inches and centimeters

#### **Optional items:**

- -pencil box: Each student will have a plastic bin supplied by the school, but a pencil box to go inside that can be helpful.
- -ear buds: The classroom has headphones, but if you prefer your own personal ear buds you can bring those.
- scissors: There are scissors in the classroom, but not enough for every student.

Feel free to keep using notebooks, folders, etc. from last year. They don't need to be new as long as they have plenty of blank pages. There are colored pencils and crayons.

# Classroom Supply List for the 5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> Grade Class 2022 to 2023 School Year

All these items should be brought on the first day of school rather than dropped off on the workday before school officially starts or on some random day during the summer.

- 1. 2 composition books (the stitch bound type) with <u>graph paper</u> inside for math work. Ordering online is sometimes faster than trying to find these locally, but it is not impossible
- 2. A ream of copy paper- that means 500 sheets- high recycled content is encouraged.
- 3. Either a pack of magic markers and/or colored pencils for personal use (whichever the student prefers) in a container marked with the student's name. If they are from this past year, make sure they still work.
- 4. 2 boxes of unused tissues for communal use. The unused part is a joke.
- 5. 100 3" X 5" note cards, the kind with lines on one side and no lines on the reverse.
- 6. 2 glue sticks.
- 7. A backpack to safely transport work and books to and from home.
- 8. 3 lined composition books- the stitched-up type with lined paper- but feel free to buy the cheapest with a good, hard cover. They are for my class, Spanish, and music. Spanish and music composition books from last year can be used for the coming year. Those lucky students will only need 1 new composition book.
- 9. A roll of masking tape. The wider the roll, the better. Seriously, students get excited about wide masking tape.
- 10. One trifold 36" X 48" cardboard poster. The student's name should be written on the back.
- 11. Students have headphones provided for computer use in class, but students may bring in a pair for personal use that will NEVER be shared with peers. If a pair is brought to class, it should remain in class and not be brought back and forth from home to school each day.
- 12. One bottle of hand soap to use for the cleaning of hands. Water will be provided by the sink.
- 13. Two pocket-folders for Spanish and music for keeping track of handouts and homework. Plastic lasts the whole year. Paper folders sometimes have to be replaced.
- 14. A bunch of pencils, say, 24. I might ask for some more halfway through the year. If you bring 48 at the beginning of the year, I promise I will not ask for more later in the school year. These are for communal use as needed.
- 15. One bottle of rubber cement.
- 16. One package (100 sheets) of lined paper. Wide-ruled is better than college-ruled paper.

#### Middle School Supply List for 2022-2023

#### **Personal Supplies**

We encourage you to re-use supplies from last year when possible.

- Pencils (at least 25)
- Pencil top erasers, Hi-Polymer eraser, or Pink Pearl eraser depending on student preference.
- Blue or black ball point pens (at least 6)
- Colored markers
- 2 glue sticks
- 6 pocket folders. Please label: English, Social Studies, Science, Math, Spanish, Music & Art (the last two subjects share 1 folder).
- 6 composition notebooks: one each for Reading, Writing, Social Studies, Science, Music, and Spanish (either wide or college ruled). 8th graders may use their Science, Social Studies, Music, and Reading notebooks from last year but will still need to purchase a new Writing notebook. Rae would like students to use their same Spanish composition book from last year.
- 1 sketch pad, around 9"X12" for Art. If students already have a sketch pad, they are encouraged to use that one. If purchasing a new pad, pick one you like. Canson, Blick, and Strathmore are fine brands.
- 1 composition notebook with graph paper for Math
- Scientific calculator similar to TI-30XIIS. Please make sure you have one with you at school clearly labeled with your name.
- Ruler
- Container (like a pencil box) to hold pencils, pens, etc.
- 7th graders only: Yoga mat (approximately 68" x 24" x 4mm) There are many to choose from and can be purchased in town (e.g., Meijer, Walmart, Dick's Sporting Goods) or online. Here is one option and another (non PVC).
- Decor for inside of locker (optional)
- Hand sanitizer (optional)

#### Supplies for classroom

- 2 reams of computer paper
- 2 sets of dry erase markers, chisel tip (not fine tipped)
- 2-24 Sharpies (either black or various colors. Students and teachers will use these for various projects throughout the year.)
- 2 rolls scotch tape
- 1 box of tissues
- 2 poster boards (22" x 28" or similar)
- 2 pads of 3X3 Post-It notes for the classroom supply
- 4 bottles liquid hand soap or 2 refill bottles
